22. Alderman Mark read a Code and Regulation Committee Report REVERSING the Zoning Board of Appeals, thereby recommending that City Council APPROVE the Special Use Permit for a Planned Mixed Use Development consisting of a group home for adjustment, private education, counseling facility, worship center and dormitory in a C-1, Limited Office District at 3520 School Street. Approval is based on the following conditions:

1. Registered sex offenders shall not be permitted to reside on the property. The property owners shall screen residents to ensure compliance with this condition.
2. Individuals with a record of violent criminal action shall not be permitted on the property. Violent criminal actions shall include but not be limited to any form of assault, abuse, kidnapping, unlawful restraint, arson, robbery, battery, homicide and/or conspiracy to commit any of the heretofore listed offenses. The property owners shall screen residents to ensure compliance with this condition.
3. Facility residents shall be women only.
4. Onsite staff supervision of the residents shall be provided twenty-four (24) hours per day seven (7) days a week.
5. The number of residents causing the facility to be classified as a "group home for adjustment", as defined by the City of Rockford Zoning Ordinance, shall be limited to no more than eight (8) at any one time.
6. At the City's request, the property owners shall provide documentation of the criminal offenses of the individuals residing in the facility, who cause the facility to be classified as a "group home for adjustment".

Approval is based on the Findings of Fact (LAD 11/19/07; ZBA #035-07).

## OFFICERS REPORTS

23. Mayor Morrissey presented a Proclamation proclaiming Saturday, October 20, 2007 to be "American Diabetes Association's Step Out To Fight Diabetes Day" in Rockford, Illinois and encouraged residents to support efforts to find a cure for this costly health problem.
24. Mayor Morrissey presented a Proclamation proclaiming the month of October 2007 to be "Domestic Violence Awareness Month" and encouraged all citizens to rally support for domestic violence and to volunteer with organizations pledging to end this crime that plagues not only our fair city but also society at large.
25. Mayor Morrissey thanked the many people who contributed to the success of the Coronado Performing Arts Center 80th Anniversary Celebration held on Sunday, October 14, 2007 with performances by the Music Academy of Rockford College. He stated the academy has approximately 1200 youth in their program along with pre-schoolers from the Rockford Head Start program that are receiving high quality education in music and performing arts.
26. Mayor Morrissey mentioned the Illinois Municipal Leagues 94<sup>th</sup> Annual Conference will be held October 18th through October 21, 2007 at the Hilton Chicago Hotel in downtown Chicago.
27. Mayor Morrissey commented on a Memorandum, which contains revised data from the results of a structural inspection of the MetroCentre deck.
28. Mayor Morrissey mentioned today he and other Rockford leaders welcomed Japanese Ambassador Ryozo Kato along with the Council General from Chicago. They toured the community and attended a luncheon at Anderson Japanese Gardens. Ambassador Kato praised the spectacular quality of the gardens which truly captures the Japanese culture.
29. Mayor Morrissey commented on an article in today's *Rockford Register Star* concerning the Police Department, which suggests since the inception of the MP3 Team there is a reduction of patrol officers on the streets. He advised that since forming the MP3 Team, on a day to day basis, there are more officers, with more coverage in the community, with more flexibility at less cost. Anyone with questions or concerns may contact Mayor Morrissey's Office or Police Chief Epperson.
30. Mayor Morrissey mentioned a Memorandum from K. William Morr, Superintendent Public Works Department, regarding Street Sweeper Operations for the week of October 15, 2007 indicating the areas and streets to be swept. For information regarding street sweeping, contact the Street Maintenance Division at 815/987-5763.
31. Alderman Timm thanked Mayor Morrissey, Chief Epperson and Deputy Chief Booker for meeting with him concerning the Rockton Avenue matter.
32. Alderman Timm mentioned taking his grandson, Michael Murphy, to Fire Station 9 on Saturday for the open house event, unfortunately both the ambulance and fire truck was

called out. He thanked Corey, Tonia and Jeff Cowles, Rockford Fire Department, for their efforts to make the afternoon enjoyable for all those attending.

33. Alderman Timm mentioned he attended the Rockford Traffic Commission Meeting and commended Steve Ernst, City of Rockford Traffic Engineer, and his staff for doing a great job.
34. Alderman Johnson mentioned she made a visit to Fire Station 11 on Saturday for the open house event and had a wonderful time.
35. Alderman Johnson expressed her concerns and best wishes to Alderman Thompson-Kelly for a speedy recovery.
36. Alderman Johnson announced she attended the Coronado Theatre birthday event with her parents on Sunday and found the children to be amazing with their music talents. Johnson congratulated former Mayor Box for receiving the first ever "Bright Light Award" for his support and dedication to the arts.
37. Alderman Johnson thanked the 8<sup>th</sup> Ward constituents and motorists for their patience during the reconstruction of Harrison Avenue. A part of the road is now open, the remainder will open the end of November, with the exception of the Harrison Avenue bridges over the railroad.
38. Alderman Jacobson extended a "hello" to Ed Naccarto, the father Anna, his family's foreign exchange student, who is visiting from Brazil.
39. Alderman Jacobson expressed concern with single-family residences in his ward having more than one family in the residence or on the property. He requested the Neighborhood Standards Department check the property at 3158 Jacqueline.
40. Alderman Jacobson again voiced his frustration with incidents involving ATV's, and expressed concern with the most recent ATV accident resulting in the critical injury of a boy. He requested Chief Epperson contact him with a follow-up of the accident.
